FAT CHANCE DRAWING

How to have fun while getting different fabrics into your stash:

Each month I will give you the type of fabric needed for the next month. You can enter more than one, but will only win one bundle per night. And you can pick the months that you want to enter. You do not have to sign up for the whole year. An idea that has worked for other members is to gather all your fat quarters and have them in a baggie with your name and give them to me all at once. I will make sure you are in the drawing. I usually try to give away at least 2 bundles each meeting. **They MUST be quilt shop fabrics.** If you are using from your stash, make sure you have not cut into the fabrics.

I hope this answers all your questions and will give the Fat Chance a try:

October—Christmas fabrics.

January—White or cream fabrics to use as backgrounds.

February—Red fabrics to use in red work.

March—Civil War fabrics.

April—black and white fabrics.

May—Batiks of any color.
