
SCRAP HAPPY

The rules are very simple. NO buying fabric. Use your stash to complete a block (pattern provided) each month. If a block is submitted your name will be entered in a drawing to win all of the blocks.

Our March block was Scrap Buster in every color/style of fabric. We had 32 blocks turned in. The lucky winner was Nancy Haskins. We were treated to Show and Tell by Ruth Hawley. She was the winner of the Scrap Happy churn dash blocks in February and showed her beautiful red/cream quilt that she created with the blocks that she won.

The block for April is the Hanky Panky block using bright batik fabrics with a light background. The unfinished size of the block is 8.5 inches. The pattern is posted on the Facebook website and in the newsletter. In the coming months I will have a limited # of copies available for members who don't use Facebook and will post to Facebook and in the Newsletter. Printing costs can add up quickly and I tend to misplace patterns that I can't look up on a phone or tablet! This system seems to be working. 
