Programs

February: Flying Geese demos

Techniques being shared are: Raw Edge flying geese, Eleanor Burns method of making flying geese, migrating flying geese, making 4 geese at a time and more. Added to the demonstrations is Tatting!!.

Come, learn, share and have fun!

March: Accordion half square triangle technique. Our first ZOOM lecture. The presentation will be during our meeting. You will be able to interact with our speaker, Beth Helfter of evapaige designs. Beth has developed this technique and has methods making quilts using it.

April: Orphan blocks, giving them a new home and purpose.

Bring blocks that measure 12.5 inches. If you have smaller blocks, add borders to measure 12.5 inches. No specific color or pattern. We will spend time laying the blocks into quilt tops. Volunteers needed to sew them together and quilt. Batting and backing fabric will also be needed. The completed quilts will be donated to a charity.

Sister Churn Dash – Opposites Attract

2 color/high contrast


Instructions for two 9.5" unfinished blocks. Finished size 9"


For each pair of blocks cut:


	Color 1	Color 2	Units
3.5 square	1	1	M make 8
4" square	4	4	make 8 31/2 With 4" Squares
3.5 x 2"	8	8	
Construction:			make 8 31/2 With 2X31/2 rectangle

Make eight Half Square triangle using the 4" squares. Square up to 3.5" Make 8 rails with 2x3.5 rectangles.

Blocks are constructed the same except you will reverse the color order.


