EMBROIDERY (REDWORK) AND COLOR TINTING CLASS

Leslie Peterson

Embroidery and color tinting have been around for many years and is a treasured skill that you will love learning. It will enhance your quilt making.

This is a class that anyone at any skill level will enjoy. The skills learned in class will make for relaxing, portable and enjoyable stitching for any season. Embroidery is perfect for inside relaxation, car riding and outdoors as a take along project.

In class you will be provided with a kit that has everything needed to complete a wall hanging sized project (except for backing, batting and special attachments that are shown as suggestions on class samples).

On the day of the class, you will learn at least 12 stitches, bead attachment and needle uses and thread types. You will choose from 7 or more possible patterns that range from seasonal, nature, and even snowmen. You will learn the art of color tinting in 4 ways, all of which are permanent and beginner friendly.

Leslie will provide you with many samples that will inspire your creativity. A kit is mandatory for each student.

Suggested Supplies:

1. Kit \$14.00 included is cost of class
2. Light box (if you have one or a sunny window)
3. Stitching Hoop (only if you choose not to use Leslie's no hoop method)
4. Thread cutting scissors
5. Note: I will need 2-3 Irons and Ironing boards for class (travel size are fine)

Members who are taking Leslie's class, she will be selling patterns and threads at the class but she only takes cash or checks, no credit cards. The kit is already included in the cost of the class, but any additional patterns or threads purchased need to be paid in cash.

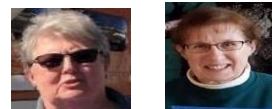


PIECEMAKERS NAME BADGES:
